Then came World War II, the deadliest military conflict in history in which an estimated 70–85 million people perished, not including those who died from natural causes. This represented about 3% of the 1940 world population, which was at that time around 2.3 billion. Most of the weapons back then just punched holes in people, one bullet, one kill, while an explosive device only destroyed a tiny piece of property, except for the small nuclear bombs that were dropped by the Americans on the Japanese cities, Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

If the current unrest that is in play as a result of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, and the likelihood of China annexing Taiwan spill over, which they could very easily do, we may see a global conflict that will make World War II appear more like a barroom brawl. With nuclear weapons of mass destruction never before known in terms of their ability to kill millions of people in a single blast, and with sufficient of them to destroy this planet and all life many times over, we need to pull back from the brink.

The really scary bit is that both President Putin of Russia, and President Xi of China are so committed to their quest for absolute power, they have the mindset and the ability to press the doomsday button, the outcome of which would be the mutual destruction of life as we know it—with them along with it. I have no doubt that their megalomaniac state will convince each of them that their resultant deaths would make them martyrs, but only in their own minds. And who would be left to adore them? If they don't care about their lives, what chance do you and I have in convincing them to abandon their current agenda?

But there's more, much more in fact, that we should be concerned about. At the very core of our problems is the human plague, a population explosion that is asserting enormous pressure on our resources and our environment. There is always a limit as to just how far any asset can be pushed. Exceed that limit and things begin to fail. Energy is at the forefront of most people's minds, as too are food supplies and the availability of consumer goods; some of which have already made it on to the endangered list.

There is an old saying that goes...*You can't make a silk purse out of a sow's ear*. Nor can we make anything from nothing. We are approaching a time when we will not have the resources to manufacture even our basic necessities, and that will herald the beginning of our painful return to the stone age. Too dramatic? I am open to any suggestion that will turn things around, which will allow a lesser number of humans to live a comfortable and productive life. In the meantime, I have iterated my thoughts and possible solutions for you to consider.
